Early School Camps focus on a different theme each week within a Montessori environment. Each day brings a balanced blend of learning and play. Themes will incorporate outdoor adventures, crafts, cooking, games and water play, where children can be creative and curious.

Full Day campers have the option of attending Sunset Club, our Extended Day care, which runs daily from 3:00 - 5:00 pm. This add-on is \$45 per day (you may choose your days; you do not have to sign up for the full week), and you may pick up your child any time between 3:00 and 5:00 pm.

What to Bring

Half Day campers should bring a nut-free, nutritious snack each day.

Full Day campers should bring a nut-free lunch and two nutritious snacks each day.

All campers should bring a change of clothes, closed-toe shoes or sneakers, sunscreen, bug repellent, hat, sunglasses, small backpack or bag for carrying items, blanket for nappers (Full Day) and a reusable water bottle.

Children will spend a large portion of their time outdoors, so appropriate clothing and gear is a necessity. Inside play space will be used when it's raining or too hot.

Paint Yourself Positive - Plein air painting is about leaving the art loft behind and experiencing painting and drawing the natural landscape. Students will explore various watercolor techniques for painting outside.

Prints and More This camp will introduce students to the production of multiple images from a single design. Emphasis is on fun designs and creative use of the materials and techniques of the relief, monoprint and silk-screen techniques.

Campers will take home a portfolio of work at the end of the week. Campers should bring a healthy snack and a water bottle each day. Children should wear clothes that can get dirty/stained, as art camp can get messy! Limited to 10 campers per session.

FRENCH LANGUAGE CAMP

Join us on this cultural journey where you will learn French, history, geography, cooking and crafts. Limited to 12 campers per session.

June 21 - 25 On this imaginary journey through France, Switzerland, Senegal, Madagascar and Canada, campers will experience Francophone culture and language. In France, campers will paint a silk pillowcase, make a "croque-monsieur or croque-madame" and watch "Le Petit Prince" in French. In Switzerland, they will learn how to felt a paperweight and make baguette sandwiches. In Senegal, they'll make a "salatu niebe" salad, paint a Senegalese dish towel and go on a scavenger hunt to learn the French names of African animals. In Madagascar, they'll create note cards with baobab trees, eat "Madagascar vanilla fruity clafouti" and learn about lemurs. In Quebec, campers will make "tarte au sucre" and play Francophone games.

June 28 - July 2 On this imaginary journey through France, campers will visit different regions and cities to experience French culture and language. The adventure begins with the creation of a French tote bag to hold souvenirs. In Paris, campers will paint a silk scarf and make a "croque-monsieur" sandwich. In Bretagne, they will create French note cards, experience the game of "pétanque" and cook "crêpes." In the Loire Valley, they'll learn facts about castles, go on a scavenger hunt and make a "mousse au chocolat." In Provence, they will decorate a flower pot, plant lavender and make "ratatouille." In the Lorraine region, campers will play the children's game "escargot", watch the French movie "Ratatouille" and bake a quiche.

Each camper must provide his own lacrosse or hockey helmet, lacrosse stick, lacrosse gloves and elbow pads. Shoulder pads are optional. Football or soccer cleats are required (no baseball spikes). No Hockey gloves please - the rigid thumbs make it difficult to play. Campers should bring a light lunch and ample personal hydration each day.
